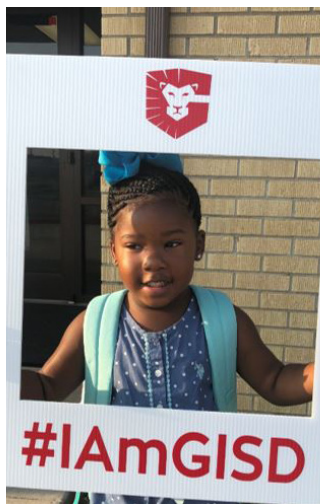
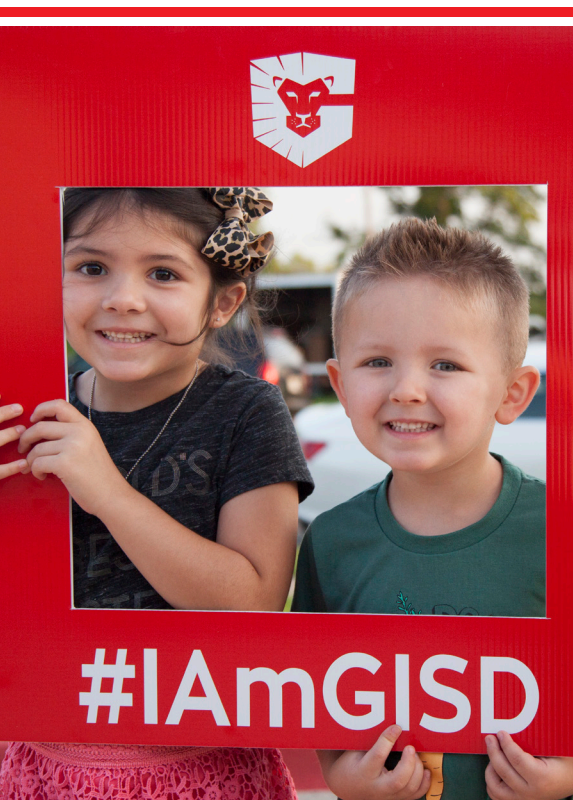

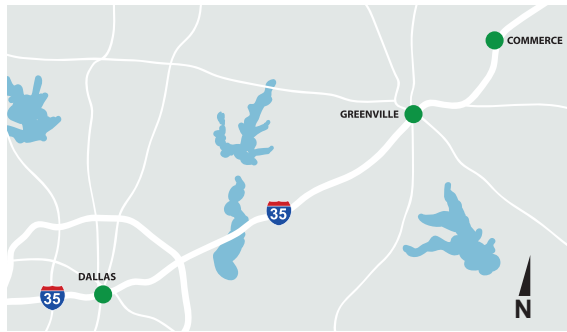

Growing in Size & Stature

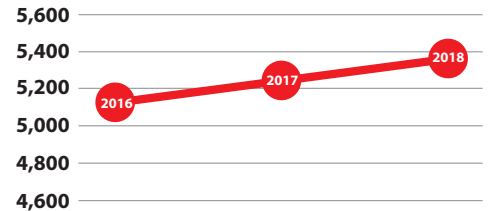

Greenville ISD is growing at a steady pace that allows it to plan for the future and introduce new programs to set it apart and to open doors for its students.

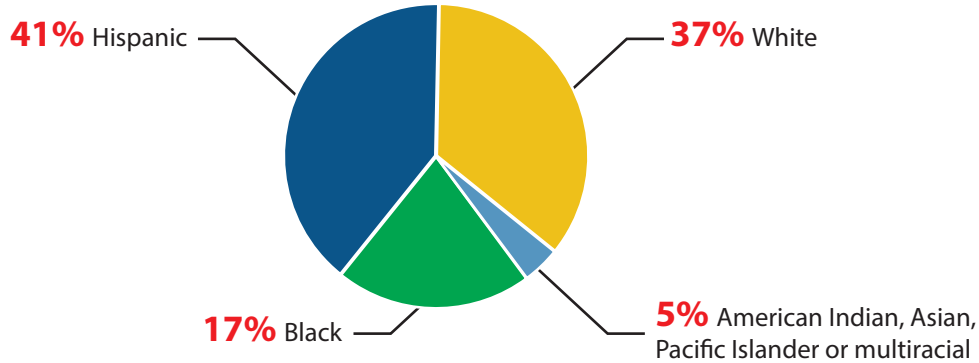
GISD – steady enrollment growth

Above or equal to state average in three critical areas

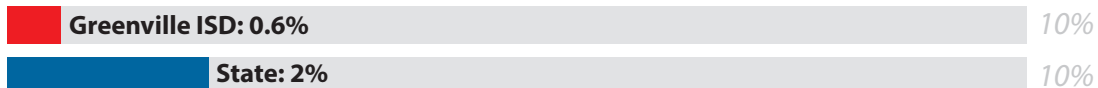
4-year graduation rate:

A Path to A&M-Commerce



1 Forever A Lion, a partnership with Texas A&M Commerce that provides a pathway to college for every Greenville High School graduate



2 Growing Up Bilingual, a dual-language program that allows students to grow up studying subjects in English and Spanish, preparing them to succeed in a competitive marketplace.



3 Elementary STEM (Science Technology Engineering Math) academy (Katherine G. Johnson STEM Academy, located @ Crockett Elementary). This dedicated school of choice emphasizes STEM exploration for elementary students.



4 Early College High School, a powerful grant-funded initiative that allows students to graduate from high school with an associate's degree.

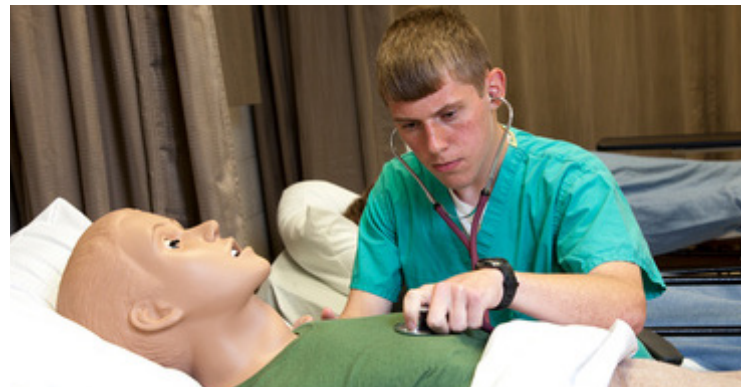
Career & Technical Education

Academic Achievement



All of Greenville ISD's campuses were highly rated, and the district received a "B" as a whole in 2018-19. In addition to the overall ratings, GSD campuses earned a total of 11 academic distinctions, which reflect outstanding student performance when compared with peers. The academic distinctions are based on how campuses performed in comparison to a group of similar size, grade span and student demographics.





College & Career Ready

Greenville ISD students can earn college credits and industry certifications to open the doors to their future.

Advanced Placement Classes: GISD offers an array of AP courses. Students who receive a qualifying score on the AP exams can earn college credit hours. At GHS, the enrollment in Pre-AP classes is 399; the enrollment in AP classes is 272.

Dual Credit: GISD partners with Paris Junior College to offer Dual Credit courses that can be transferred to colleges. GHS offers 38 hours in core dual credit courses.

Industry Certifications: Students can graduate with industry certifications that qualify them for jobs after graduation or while they are attending college.

Points of Pride



Greenville High School students have won four National Solar Car Championships! Their summer trek takes them from Fort Worth to California, and students put their engineering, design, and teamwork skills to work.

The GHS Robowranglers are three-time world champions. They partner with engineers and other mentors from L3 and Innovation First International throughout the year.

Excellent professional development offerings foster lifelong learning, continuous improvement and spark inspiration.

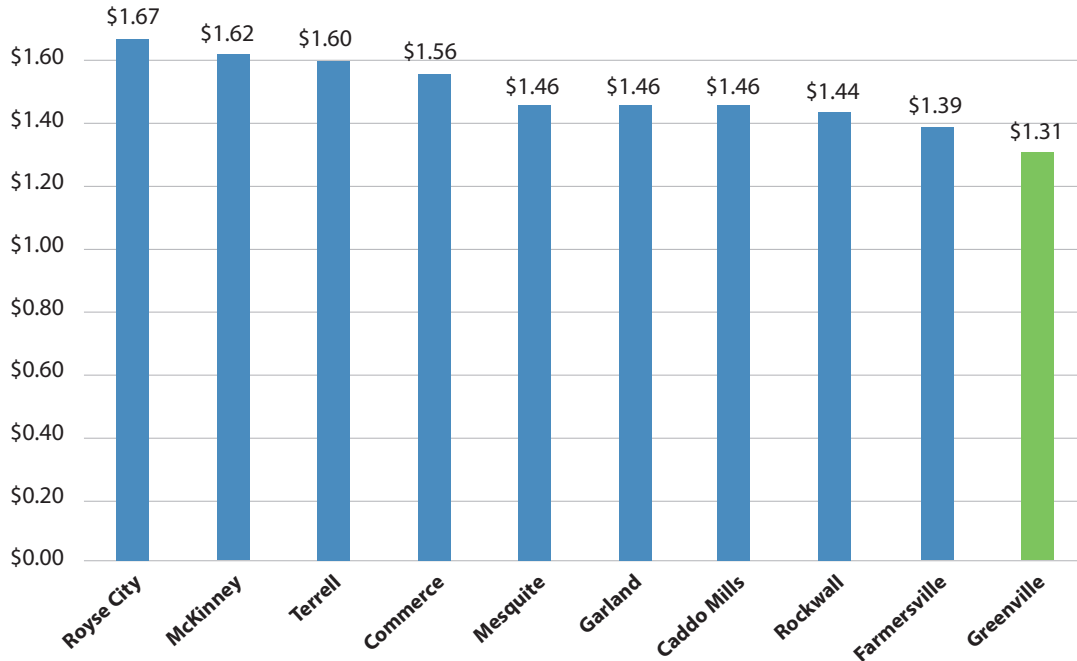


Fiscal Responsibility
